PRESIDENT: Sir?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I want to advance the bill to E & R so that I can then return it to Select File for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: We ordinarily use a voice vote. It's up to the Chair to determine that. The Chair has a prerogative of asking for a machine vote to assist. There probably would be a request of that anyway. I'm going to ask for a machine vote to assist the Chair in determining whether a majority wants the bill advanced. The motion is to advance LB 432. Record your vote. Clear the board please. Have you voted? Record. Well no, that's just a mere majority. That's.... Then I'm sorry. Alright. Do you want to put the House under Call then? Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, because of the confusion we're having, I'm going to place the House under Call. It takes 25 votes and there's one short.

PRESIDENT: Alright. The question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. Senator Kelly voting aye.

CLERK: Kelly voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers moves that the Call be raised. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The Call is raised. Report the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays, 18 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk. I move to return LB 432 to Select File for a specific amendment To strike Section 3. Signed, Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature. This is the amendment that I mentioned in the handout on your desks and that I discussed. It would strike all reference to emergency. The only thing left in the bill is the training requirement. All reference to emergency, I'm telling you, will be stricken from the bill by this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, if a bill is brought back for a specific amendment can the specific amendment be amended before it's adopted? OK.
