SENATOR BARNETT: That was my next question because Senator Simpson had made a statement that the Governor was transferring this agency anyway in an appropriations bill, but you say that has been killed now.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes sir.

SENATOR BARNETT: OK, then so this bill, if it was passed, would take over, if it was killed there would be no transfer.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: So you're asking for it to be delayed at least a year by sending it back for public hearing.

SENATOR MARSH: No, I'm asking it be delayed at least a week because that's how long it takes to set a public hearing.

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes, but we won't be able to act on this bill then anyway, will we?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes sir, we could if there is a vital reason for doing so we would be able to act on it.

SENATOR BARNETT: OK.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, do you wish to close debate on this matter? The question is shall this bill go to the Reference Committee for purposes of public hearing. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, Reference Committee report refers LB 597 to Appropriations Committee.

Mr. President, your Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance, to whom was referred LB 936, instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation it be indefinitely postponed.

Mr. President, I move we adjourn until 9 o'clock, Friday, February 13th. Signed, Senator Burbach.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. We are adjourned.
