PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. At this time I'd like to recognize 27 sixth grade students from North Loup in Scotia in Senator Rasmussen's district. Seated next to Senator Rasmussen is his daughter. The teacher with the group is Glenn Holtz.

Mr. Speaker, do you... At this time also I'd like to recognize that Doug Bereuter has a new son, Kirk. Making his first visit to the floor here. Welcome.

CLERK: Read title to LB 977. There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach ... or Senator Clark. Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: The only thing this bill will do will be to use the revolving funds for the Transportation Services instead of the General Fund. The Governor has asked for this. I think it's a fair bill. Instead of taking the money from each individual agency that they should have been doing along time ago they've been taking it out of the General Fund and putting the money back in. This way they can use the revolving fund. That's really all the bill does.

I would move the advancement of the bill to E & R.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion? If not the question is to advance LB 977 to E & R initial. Please vote.

CLERK: Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Mr. Speaker, what's your pleasure. Read the reports.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Simpson asked to be excused on Friday, February 27th.

PRESIDENT: Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Urban Affairs, to whom was referred LB 774, instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 825 General File as amended. Signed, Senator Fowler, Chairman.

Mr. President, your Committee on Revenue, to whom was referred LB 668, instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 996 General File; 646 indefinitely postponed; 731 indefinitely postponed and 759 indefinitely postponed.
