PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is shall the bill be advanced. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have some material to read in to the Journal. Mr. President, Senator Dworak asked to be excused at 3:30.

Mr. President, a new bill, LB 630A. Read title to LB 630A.

Mr. President, notice of an Executive Session. Senator Maresh gives notice that the Labor Committee will meet at 8 o'clock in Room 2102 on Friday, February 27th.

Mr. President, your Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance, to whom was referred LB 951, instructs me to report the same is indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Murphy.

Mr. President, your Committee on Urban Affairs, to whom was referred LB 765, instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation it be indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Fowler.

PRESIDENT: LB 426. This is the priority list according to the Speaker. These noncontroversial or controversial? Controversial he says. Yes sir.

SPEAKER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I have just given a list. I would like to read it to the members of the body. We are now going back. We have taken care of three priority bills LB... Has 426 not been Well this is right. This is why I wondered why it's up on the board. This is General File. One, two and three have been completed. Senator Clark's 426, Senator Moylan's 652, Senator Stull's 721 have been processed. So we have number four, Senator Rumery's bill, 634 and 634A. I suppose we'll have to jump to the next one because Senator Skarda is not here. Then we have the list as you have it. I will read it for the benefit of the members.

If you recall... I will place on your desk, very shortly, the other bills that are priority bills. Senator Rumery, Senator Skarda, myself, the Telecommunications Committee, Senator Carsten and then Senator Hasebroock, or Burbach for Governor bill - 971, Senator Koch's bill, Senator Kremer's, Senator Murphy, Senator Savage, Senator Johnson, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Kelly, Senator Warner and Senator Kime. I'm sure you know your own numbers. I'll place this on your desk in just a few moments.
