PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The motion is to move the bill. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 1 nay, 15 not voting, Mr. President. LB 634A introduced by Senator Rumery. Read title. There are no Committee amendments or other amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think the "A" bill is self explanatory and I move its...move to assign the bill to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of that motion. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 763. All right. LB 182.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 182 introduced by Senator Kelly, 35th District. Read title. There are Committee amendments by Senator Rasmussen's Government Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen. Who is going to handle the Committee amendments? Senator Kelly, do you handle the Committee amendments then?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I would be asking unanimous consent to bracket LB 182 until Wednesday, March 3rd based on the fact that LB 987 contains a lot of the merits of LB 182 and some members of this body are interested in other facets of 987, namely, lobbyists regulations and conflict of interest regulations. That bill is still in Committee and I do not believe it to be proper to discuss 182 until we know a little bit more about 987, and on that statement, I would request unanimous consent to bracket 182 until Wednesday, March 3rd.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? So ordered. The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: I have no objection but I would like to ask Senator Kelly, what assurance do you have that the other bill will be ready prior to Wednesday?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, I have no assurances but I am aware that Senator Luedtke and Senator Frank Lewis are working like mad to see that this is on the floor soon and we believe that March 3rd would be practical to bracket this to.

SENATOR BURBACH: Could I make a suggestion, Senator Kelly, that it be the first order of business following the other bill. Senator Kelly, would you care to
