SENATOR CLARK: My button isn't operating. I voted no but it isn't operating.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: How many are there that are suppose to be here? Have the Sergeant at Arms at least bring everybody in to (inaudible) on this bill.

PRESIDENT: All right.

CLERK: There are three excused, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator George voting aye.

CLERK: Senator George voting aye. Voting aye, voting aye, Senator Wiltse voting aye. Record vote read. See pages 852 and 853, Journal. 34 ayes, 10 nays, 5 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 710 passes with the emergency clause attached. According to our agenda, we have pending motions. One on LB 724.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Duis asks unanimous consent to hold LB 724 in the possession of the Legislature until March 9th.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, on Friday when we worked up our agenda for today, we decided after telephone conversations that Senator Cope would be with us today but I have been informed that he will not be with us today until Wednesday. So I would like to ask to pass over 339 and hopefully, because of the illness of Senator Cope, we don't have a good solid handle on what we are doing but I am asking because he informed me that he would be here on Wednesday so pass it over.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis, what is your request for LB 724?

CLERK: To hold 724 in the possession of the Legislature until March 9th?

PRESIDENT: You are asking for unanimous consent to hold this bill until March 9. Is there objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered. Now you are asking unanimous consent, Senator Burbach, on LB 339. Senator Burbach.

CLERK: To hold it until March 3rd.

PRESIDENT: You are asking for unanimous consent on that. Is there an objection to Senator Burbach's request? Seeing none, it is so ordered. LB 811.
