PRESIDENT: Read the amendment.

CLERK: Read amendment. See page 885 and 886, Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, this relates to the amendment that I placed on the habitat bill on Friday, after talking and working with a number of people interested in it so that my intentions would be clear and so that there is a workability of the program. This amendment says that a plan will be presented for the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature for their approval. It does not restrict the use of the fees until the plan is there but I am sure that plan will be there by the first of January. I think the Games and Parks Commission has got the message of the Legislature loud and clear and that is my intent and my intent is to see that they take that plan and that program to the members of the Appropriations Committee where they will seek approval and I would ask you to adopt my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, colleagues, Senator Lewis brought his amendment back and we went over it and it complies with his initial request and fears and we have corrected the wording in it and I support the Lewis amendment now on the floor.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Amendment passes.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there is an amendment offered by Senator Rasmussen printed on page 891 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, Vince, those are the ones I withdrew this morning.

CLERK: Oh, okay.

PRESIDENT: It shall be done. Mr. Clerk.
