SENATOR DUIS: I really don't know, Senator Murphy. I told them when they came to me objecting to what I had done that I was just going to sort of ride along here and see what happened because it was getting pretty complicated. So consequently I've got to wait and see because I'm not sure that Senator DeCamp and Senator Cavanaugh have really gotten together as much as they think they've gotten together yet or understand just exactly what this amendment has done to the bill as it came to the floor of the Legislature, amended by the Committee.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: We did anticipate this. There's an assessment of up to \$10,000 per physicians so I think that pretty clearly answers that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I'm curious. Senator DeCamp, could you tell me where that is? I'm reading something about assessments will be later provided by bylaws that will be later provided.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Section 11.

SENATOR MURPHY: Section 11? Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stoney, would you like to close debate on your motion?

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I won't waste additional time. I think the amendment is fairly selfexplanatory. I did indicate to Senator Duis that I'll be happy to check with the Director of Insurance should this amendment be adopted. If he has any objection I'll be happy to remove it at a later time. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Stoney's amendment to 809. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stoney's amendment is adopted.

CLERK: The next amendment, Mr. President, is offered by Senator Dworak. It reads as follows: Insert a new section 20 as follows. Section 20. ... well what it is is the severability clause, Mr. President.

SENATOR DWORAK: I think we're taking that out of sequence.

CLERK: My apology. That doesn't even apply to the bill.
