Select File. Signed Senator Dworak, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: We completed Select File just before the recess. We will now commence General File, LB...

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Koch asks unanimous consent to unbracket LB 579 and then he has a motion on it. Mr....Senator Koch does not make such a request.

PRESIDENT: General File, LB 819.

CLERK: LB 819 introduced by Senator Mills and Dworak. It was first considered...it relates to labor, to revise conditions disqualifying individuals from receiving unemployment. The bill was first considered on March 8th. The Committee amendments have been adopted. An amendment offered by Senator Cavanaugh is presently pending and then there are some additional amendments. The amendment, Mr. President, by Senator Cavanaugh would read: Read amendment. See page 997, Journal. The motion was first considered yesterday.

PRESIDENT: We are on your amendment, I think, Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: My understanding was I had closed so what happens?

PRESIDENT: We are ready for the vote then. Senator Mills, for what purpose do you ask recognition.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, would you restate that in where we are now.

PRESIDENT: We completed debate and Senator Cavanaugh has closed on his motion. I will have the Clerk read it once more.

CLERK: The motion is as follows: Read amendment. See page 997, Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh, in fairness, there were some lights that were on that I did not see and I did recognize some people, so if you choose, you may have additional some sort of closing, if you would like.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: What?

PRESIDENT: As I recall, just before we recessed and you had closed, there were some people that said they didn't realize you were closing and I did recognize a couple of people, so in all fairness to you, if you want to make an additional statement if there is anything to reply to, you do have the floor for that purpose.
