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to know where it's going. I simply won't settle for the fact that Woody Varner and Breckenridge and Zumburg and the Board of Regents haven't done their job. That's a serious accusation. If I've appropriated these monies in the past and they have not applied them properly to the education of the undergraduate of this state then we ought to know something more about it. We can't let that continue to operate. We can't let those people continue to operate in that fashion.

PRESIDENT: Two minutes.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I think you better put up a little more than you have so far, Senator Bereuter.

PRESIDENT: The Chair has had a request that Section 8 be further divided for purposes of voting. It appears as if a discernable question would still remain. Therefore Section 8 shall be divided so that when it is put to a vote the narrative material, as proposed by Senator Bereuter, would be voted on separately from the balance of Section 8. So the effect of this is that we would vote on Senator Bereuter's proposal separately. Senator.... The Chair would like to request that debate confine itself to Senator Bereuter's proposition. We'll vote on that first. Thank you. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I rise to support Senator Bereuter. Senator Bereuter, this morning, has made one of the most decisive speeches on this floor in respect to the mission and purpose of the University. The primary mission and purpose of that University still has to be at the undergraduate level. Senator Bereuter suggests to you a way in which to make sure that you get that kind of improvement and quality. I, for one, cannot let the remarks against him go unchallenged. I believe that he hastied down program to do what is absolutely necessary in undergraduate education, that is to improve the student-teacher ratio, to put the quality professors at the undergraduate level. That's what he's proposed to do. I've had questions myself, Senator Cavanaugh, on the Area of Excellence. I am a member of the Visitation Team on nontraditional education. I did attend the visitation. I'm here to tell you that two of the three programs we talked about were graduate education programs. We talked about the graduate education programs in terms of the doctor of education degree, we talked about the coordination and visited coordination between Peru State College and the University on a graduate program. The non-graduate program we talked about was the student-teacher program. Senator Bereuter suggests to you that we need to make sure that we provide a quality educational program at the undergraduate level. I think that's absolutely important. I think that's absolutely imperative. I believe that Senator Bereuter has explained in vivid detail how he plans to do that. I believe that Senator Bereuter has put the necessary limitations on it to see that that will go into full effect and force. It's very interesting that we have the feeling that the quality professors must teach at the graduate level, that the undergraduate students should not be exposed to the quality professors. Senator Bereuter and I have discussed
