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presently in a law suit in taking on this very serious subject that we are talking about now, territory. This is nothing new to the field of liquor and beer franchise and this sort of thing in Nebraska. It is terribly muddled and needs clarification. We considered both bills, I say we and the committee decided on the route which is amendment to this bill which was the best approach to the problem and not withstanding...

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, wasn't I closing?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I beg your pardon.

SENATOR KOCH: I was closing. You said, Senator Koch, do you want to close. There was no lights on at the time I posed the questions. Here we are again allowing people to take liberties with our rules. You distinctly said to me, Senator Koch, will you close.

PRESIDENT: Turn him off. I would like to respond, Senator Koch, I really can't remember if I said you were closing or not. I doubt that Senator because I wrote Senator DeCamps name down and Senator Luedtke's name came up right after that. I could be in error, Senator Koch, Senator Luedtke, would you proceed?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would just stop at this point by merely saying that this was the approach which a very careful study on the part of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee decided it was the means of clarifying the matter of territories of this kind of business in Nebraska. It's going to have to be done either this year or next year. It's got to be done because it's a terrible legal muddle right now. This is wone way of taking care of it. We just as well take care of it in this bill.

PRESIDENT: There are no further lights. Now, Senator Koch, would you close, and again if I was mistaken, I apologize.

SENATOR KOCH: Well thank you, Mr. President. No ill feelings. I would be confused too if I were you because it's difficult here. I think I made mypoint. I don't think I need to add anything more but when I walk out of here today I can walk out of here knowing I had to do what had to be done. So I close that. I ask to bring it back to strike it and if the body doesn't see fit to, I guess that's a decision I'll live with.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill be returned. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you voted? Record. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, I ask for a call House. A roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Alright. The question is, shall the house go under call. Record your vote on that proposition. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes. 3 nays. Whoops. 20 ayes. 3 nays.
