SENATOR CHAMBERS: The problem is that I just got it. I haven't had a chance to read it. I need that opportunity so I can't do it.

PRESIDENT: Alright. It would be appropriate for me then to call on Senator Schmit to move the adoption of Section one then wouldn't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

PRESIDENT: Alright. I think we ought to commence the work on this matter now. Apparently that's the wish of the body. Senator Schmit, would you be kind enough to move the adoption of Section 1 and make whatever statement you care to.

CLERK: Mr. President....

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move the adoption of Section 1. No further statement necessary.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, a technical matter. I think you ought to move to strike lines two and three in your computer print-out because that relates to LB 703 and we're talking about 434.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, Mr. President. I agree to that suggestion. I move to strike lines 1 and 2 and adopt the rest of Section 1.

PRESIDENT: Alright, this should be a machine vote. There's been a motion to strike lines 2 and 3 on page 1 of the computer print-out. Record your vote. Please vote on this matter. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to reject lines 2 and 3, page 1.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now Senator.... It's rejected. Senator Schmit, would you now move Section 1.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move the adoption of Section 1.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? Senator Cavanaugh, your light is on. Senator Chambers, did you want to be heard on Section 1?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, now I told Senator Schmit that I'm acting in good faith. If he doesn't want to say anything on any of the provisions of the bill then I think we're dealing in a game. I have told you all that there's not been enough time to read the print-out. He can at least say what these provisions are. I said I would not subdivide the sections. Section 2 has a number of words. I could ask for a division of that but, Senator Schmit, that's not what I'm doing. I'm not trying to delay. I think if he is not going to consent to at least give a statement of what these sections are and the meaning that he understands the section to have then I would ask for additional discussion.
