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want more tax money. We want to spend more money but we don't want to tell people we want to spend your money so we are going to tax you for it so again we subvert it by making a special tax on a special product, involved or not. Let's devote the 55% that that industry is already being taxed to support this program and stop trying to fool the general public. I don't think they are that easily fooled.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am concerned about this amendment, too, because I just received a phone call from a Mrs. Holmstead and it had to do with another community health program and she said she has got nothing but phone calls, and I said how many, and she couldn't tell me or who from, but whenever we are getting mixed up in this community health program, mental health program, I think we are going to run into some real avenues of problems because, apparently, what we have is we have a personality conflict up above in the administration and they don't want to report to this one or that one or report to the other one so then they get ahold of all these wonderful people who volunteered to do the work and it is going to be really mixed up and I am real concerned about the community deal and, Senator Barnett, I think you are going to put more work over into them. Is this correct or not? You see, if we do this, then we are going to have this personality conflict, apparently, on an administrative level and like I tried to tell Mrs. Holmstead I was concerned about the amount of money that was being spent administratively and the fact that these people didn't get along apparently on the regional level and on the local level or between regions or with the Department of Institutions, now there has got to be somebody who has accountability, and according to this, I would presume that is the Department of Institutions going to have the accountability in this?

SENATOR BARNETT: Right along with the local boards in the mental health regions.

SENATOR DUIS: This is, apparently, what they are complaining about in an amendment that Senator Marvel put on so that we could get accountability. Now what are we going to do? Are we going to fragment it some more?

SENATOR BARNETT: No, because you see right now, they receive very little funds and do very little work in the alcohol area but they are already set up to do some. This will make it more specific and more accountable.

PRESIDENT: Which Senator will close debate on this, Senator Anderson or Senator Barnett?

SENATOR BARNETT: That will be fine. It doesn't make any difference.

PRESIDENT: Which one? Senator Anderson, to close debate on the amendment.
