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the learning experience for the med student but also reduce the income to the hospital by virtue of having the patient in the hospital occupying a bed.

SENATOR WARNER: So the purpose of Senator Cavanaugh's amendment, so I understand it specifically, is to, in effect, put in the permission for the expenditure that he took out the other day of \$194,000 although we do not know the amount.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, he is just providing the permission to pay the doctor regardless of which institution.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. Would I also be correct in stating that if the patient goes to a hospital other than the University Hospital or a government owned one, we would have paid anyway.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, absolutely.

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you, Senator Goodrich, so, in effect, it appears to me Senator Cavanaugh kind of got caught with his amendment and he needs a way out. I didn't support putting this in the other day but I did support taking it out but I think that the members that'd like to help Senator Cavanaugh get out of this bind I think you ought to vote yes.

SENATOR MAHONEY PRESIDING

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think if you will look at your calendar, tomorrow is very likely the last day on General File. I think it is very imperative. I don't think we have any other choice but to move along much, much faster than we have to discuss and to stop amending, amending, because we meet in annual sessions. If we have an error, let's rectify the error next year. If we have a void in our legislation, let's take care of it next year. We have an obligation. We have got to finish these appropriation bills. We have got to fill a few other bills. It is a concern of this body where the space will be allocated when the other offices move out of the State Building. This must be determined and now. We also have LB 987 which has to do with campaign and conflicts of interest, openness in government. We have these. We have several other bills of statewide importance. I urge you and I plead with you, let us move on, and as soon as we have finished this 691 after this amendment, that we do take up 434. It was a decision made by this body that this bill should be discussed at this time and that we proceed from there and hopefully we will be calling the question every few moments because we just cannot stand here and argue, argue all the time when we have a deadline as of tomorrow night. I ask for the previous question.
