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me here watching over the time. I would just say to Senator Chambers that in all of his great oratory today he rose from the whisper to the loudness. He did bring us into meetings and pitter-patter and as we were walking, etc. Mr. President, I also have candidates. Mr. President, I, like Senator Chambers, am on dangerous ground when I speak in favor of something that is not in my district.

Mr. President, I also must say that in all meetings in which the Senators were present that are here today, luncheon meeting Senator Chambers, meetings in which they were brought forward and certain facts and figures. Mr. Kiewit at each and every time was a gentleman. Mr. Kiewit was soft in his approach. Mr. Kiewit has extended the same courtesy through outstate Nebraska. With the wonderful gifts to Wesleyan and to the City of Wally Barnett. Mr. Kiewit has also gone to Hastings, Nebraska and made a fine institution there and as you have mentioned, Senator Chambers, he has given money to other institutions such as Creighton University. Senator Chambers, there comes a time that if a man has his birthplace within a city, and he feels the pride, I know you're waving you head at me.....

PRESIDENT: I had to remind Senator Chambers and we are talking about the P.E. building which I don't believe Mr. Kiewit.....

SENATOR MAHONEY: But I think even Senator Chambers, even in fairness, would say that Senator Mahoney ought to have the occasion.....

PRESIDENT: But he isn't the presiding officer. Notwithstanding what you may think, Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: No, but there comes a time when Senator Chambers on this occasion.....

PRESIDENT: Please direct your remarks to the motion to indefinitely postpone the bill having to do with the physical education building.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Well then, you know sometimes you win and you lose, as Senator Carpenter says, and in order to say on the subject matter and be very very brief, I as a friend of Senator Carpenter am one who has to say and admit to this body that Mr. Kiewit is not the evil that has been portrayed here today by Senator Chambers.
