PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of the bill as amended. Record your vote. Record. Senator....

CLERK: 32 ayes, 2 nays to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SYAS: I have a reconsideration up there.

PRESIDENT: Read the reconsideration.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Syas moves to reconsider LB 464.

SENATOR SYAS: I'll tell you why. I want to be sure about this. I'm on the prevailing side. I voted to kill the bill, but it seems to me that we're outlawing bingo. I think we're in a lot of trouble if that is true. I'm asking you if you want to reconsider it, here's your chance. If we're doing that why I think we've all got something to think about. There seems to be a difference of opinion around here whether we need this bill to retain bingo or not.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Is that motion to be taken up right now?

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: I'm willing to reconsider, Mr. President, on the basis of the amendment, although I think before it was advanced it ought to have the other provision stripped.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall this body reconsider its action on 464. Record your vote.

SENATOR SYAS: Well now wait a minute. Go ahead. I've heard that this ... if we don't pass this....

PRESIDENT: George, Senator Syas, we're voting. Please vote. The question is shall we reconsider our action. Record. Twenty-five. Do you want the House to go under Call? Alright. The ques.... Clean the board. Shall the House go under Call. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 14 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. Would all of you kindly return to your chairs and record your presence. It's getting so dark we can't see you. Please record your presence. Please return to your chairs and record your presence. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms do whatever they please. There isn't anything to do! If they're not here I don't know where they are. Senator Warner. Would the Senators please return to your desks. Record your presence. We think that's what it is. Record this, Mr. Clerk.
