It is a back up case, I presume from clear back then.

SENATOR KREMER: It is, but as I said Senator Duis, if this thing doesn't even materialize, we still need these people in the Attorney General's office. Because we have problems that are going to run out of our ears in about four or five years.

SENATOR DUIS: I am trying to strengthen your case by saying that at that time they had a special attorney named Bert Overcash. What they are doing is that they want the same situation again. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: No, further lights. The question then is the return of the bill for the specific amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned, move your amendment please Senator.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I move the amendment be adopted as outlined.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. That is the question record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, the bill is adopted. Do you move to advance the bill Senator Kremer?

SENATOR KREMER: I move to advance Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Anderson reoffers his motion for an amendment with a dollar figure reduced to \$160,000. On 691 again.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: I would just like to alert the body that we have, and I don't have a record of that one I don't believe, is this Senator Anderson's amendment?
