SENATOR BARNETT: Vince, would you enlighten me again on that. I was busy talking. Withdraw it. I ask unanimous consent to withdraw it.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp offers the following amendment to 464 to add the emergency clause.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I agreed I wouldn't use the bill anymore for anything to do with the lottery so I will not. However, the Revenue Department says that they need the emergency clause on it to accomplish their purposes. That is all it is.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I was in the back. Did Senator Barnett withdraw his amendment?

PRESIDENT: Yes, he did.

SENATOR SYAS: The only thing before us is the emergency clause?

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir.

SENATOR SYAS: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is the adoption of Senator DeCamp's amendment which would add the emergency clause. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The DeCamp amendment is adopted.

CLERK: A motion to advance, then, would be in order.

PRESIDENT: We have in the South balcony we have a group that crosses District boundaries. We have 31 4-H Club members. They are from Platte County, Senator Dworak, and also from Nance County and Polk County, which is Senator Bereuter's District, and Butler County, which is Senator Schmit. Representatives of this group are going to Washington, D. C. for the National meeting. We are very happy that you took time to visit us. Thank you very much.

CLERK: Mr. President, we need a motion to advance 464.

PRESIDENT: Whose bill is it?

CLERK: Senator Dworak is the E & R Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Yes, is he around. Senator Barnett.
