PRESIDENT: All right. Discussion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned, Senator Savage.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is to adopt the emergency clause.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I so move.

PRESIDENT: Discussion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment carries. Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I move it be returned to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is readvanced. Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, two short announcements for the good of the House. Number one, the Unicameral party will be at 6:30 tonight. There is some misunderstanding of what the time is. It is 6:30, depending upon when the Legislature adjourns. The second announcement is that in Hall County yesterday and last night it rained one inch.

CLERK: LB 821.

PRESIDENT: All right. Is Senator Schmit around? No, here he comes.

CLERK: Mr. President, on 821, the E & R amendments have been adopted. Senator Schmit offers a 20 page amendment.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment I offer on 821 would place responsibility for certification to the federal government with the Department of Environmental Control. It is a lengthy amendment but that is basically what the amendment does. It gives the certification authority to the Department of Environmental Control. I am sorry I didn't get a chance to explain it to Senator Kremer ahead of time, but if the bill passes, I think we should buy that amendment. That is all the amendment does.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, just a question to Senator Schmit. Senator Schmit, when you speak of certification, are you referring to the operator or the certification of the facilities?
