SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Marsh, I will accept what you recommend provided that the Governor's letter is addressed to the members of the Legislature or to Senator Savage, but not merely a copy of a letter addressed to somebody else.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Thank you Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I understand that 265 has been correctly engrossed. The amendment suggested ... or brought to our attention by Senator DeCamp has been withdrawn. The bill is sitting up there. We have time to read it. I move that LB 265 be read on Final Reading at this time.

So we will need to be in session for awhile. I would support Senator Kremer's suggest that we go back to Final Reading and read LB 265, take it out of the bracket and read it.

PRESIDENT: Alright. We are now on Final Reading. Would all Senators kindly return to your desks. Only senatorial personnel on the floor. Please return to your seats so that we can commence with Final Reading. Senator Skarda.

SENATOR SKARDA: Senator Carsten, would you please return to your seat. The Speaker has asked three times and I think out of ... common ordinary sense it should be done.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Commence reading of LB 265.

CLERK: Read title to LB 265.

PRESIDENT: LB 265 passes. Mr. Speaker, that's all we have. Are we going to stand at ease for awhile? Should we be at ease for awhile? What time, Mr. Speaker? Half hour?

SENATOR BURBACH: I may be a little more explicit. As soon as the Bill Drafting Department brings the bills back up here. We need.... I suppose about a half hour. Then we'll need a quorum here to accept them.

PRESIDENT: Alright. We will stand at ease then until twenty after five.
