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mind think a couple times. You just begin to wonder some times ... we ought to come back over and see what Senator Chambers is saying. Sometimes I think you're up so often that your self-destruction actually hurts you. I hate to say that to you, but you waited till this one and it was planned so that it was last and then you did your best. What you didn't tell the Legislature and the legislators and the Lincoln Journal, which seems to be your favorite newspaper and they do a good job, that approximately 30,000 employees, Senator Chambers, are employed in this downtown area. Senator Chambers, in this area there are white blue collar workers and there are blue ... there are black blue collar workers which live to the North. They can walk to this educational facility. They don't have to take taxi cabs, don't have to have their own transportation. But from my district and Senator Skarda's district, Senator Cavanaugh's district, parts of Senator Moylan's district you can walk to this educational facility. There are again, Senator Chambers, 30,000 employees in downtown Omaha. Senator Chambers, this is 19 percent of the city work force. You have to get all these figures down because it's important. Now we're not able to get out into the fancy pants neighborhoods and find parking out in the Fair Acres. This is great. This is where the University seat should be. It should be out there in the West. We're asking that where we do have the greater bulk of these employees and where the headquarters, Senator Chambers, the Union Pacific Railroad, all of the lines West, the Union Pacific Railroad. They can leave their building and be able to walk over and take courses in computing, management courses, they can take all courses that will get them higher jobs, more improvement in their occupation. Then you know, Senator Chambers, that Northwestern Bell Telephone Company it's headquarters is not in Minneapolis, Minnesota which is a much larger state. The headquarters for all these states in the Midwest is in Omaha. Those employees can come down from 19th street and walk down and take courses. Senator Chambers, another great business that takes in many of the Midwestern states is Northern Natural Gas. Their headquarters is in Omaha. Again there is the human cry, Senator Chambers, for courses, educational courses, both blue and white collar workers. Then, Senator Chambers, even Mutual of Omaha is part and parcel of this. These are the mysterious donors that I've heard you say time and time again "Who are these donors?" These are some large donors along with Mr. Keewit. This is the very heart beat of the city. This is Union Pacific Railroad. We are on the eastern end of their line. We still have their headquarters. We still have Northwestern Bell Telephone headquarters in Omaha, Nebraska. We still have Northern Natural Gas headquarters in Omaha, Nebraska. Why should we not offer them educational facilities? That's what this bill does. Did you know, Senator Chambers, too in your figures ... and the legislators did not have this, and I'll be very short, that there is \$158 million of new construction in the space of downtown Omaha, \$158 million. So that's not true what you said. You might have done a little fibbing and said that this was just a big project to do some renovation and urban renewal. Senator Chambers, I'm amazed that two blocks is
