PRESIDENT: Thank you. Is there any objection? Seeing none.... Read the bill.

CLERK: Read title to LB 76.

(Machine turned off for Final Reading)

PRESIDENT: For what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Question of the Chair.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Is it your ruling that this is an appropriation bill and not the Governor's recommendation?

PRESIDENT: I don't think it appropriates any money.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Alright, fine, thank you. I just rise to give you my greetings.

PRESIDENT: I appreciate that Senator Lewis. Thank you.

CLERK: Senator Anderson voting aye. Senator Anderson changing from aye to no. Voting aye Senators Burbach, Burrows, Carsten, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Duis, Dworak, Fitzgerald, Fowler, George, Goodrich, Kelly, Keyes, Koch, F. Lewis, Luedtke, Mahoney, Marsh, Mills, Moylan, Rasmussen, Rumery, Savage, Schmit, Simpson, Skarda, Swigart, Syas.

Voting nay Senators Anderson, Barnett, Bereuter, Clark, Kennedy, Kime, R. Lewis, Maresh, Marvel, Murphy, Nichol, Stoney, Stull and Warner.

Not voting Senators Cope, DeCamp, Dickinson, Hasebroock, Johnson, Kremer and Wiltse.

28 ayes, 14 nays, 7 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 76 passes. Senator Murphy, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MURPHY: Question of the Chair if I may.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR MURPHY: In your interpretation that this does not appropriate money, would that mean that in order to fund this bill we would have to have an "A" bill?

PRESIDENT: As I understand the bill you would, but this doesn't provide for any increases in the budget. The only ones that require a 30 vote majority are those that would increase the budget over and above the Governor's recommendation. Since this has nothing to do with the budget, at least in this fiscal year, as I understand it requires no money. These new pay scales come about at the commencement of other terms for the various judges, etc., as I understand it, Senator Murphy.
