SENATOR MURPHY: I am a little perturbed. This thing isn't on Select File, is it?

PRESIDENT: No, I am...

SENATOR MURPHY: It must be on Final.

PRESIDENT: I am not sure what it is, but unless I find a rule for it, I think maybe that rule should be put in. But in any event, it does require 30 votes now but to reconsider only takes 25. There may be a void in the rules but I would not rule that way.

SENATOR MURPHY: What did he say, Senator? All right. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right. The question is, shall LB 1007....

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We are under Call, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir. All Senators please stay in your chair. The question is, shall LB 1007 become law notwithstanding....

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Requested a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And we haven't checked in. I am just trying to do it right.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we never checked in.

PRESIDENT: All right. I think everybody is here. Record your presence. All right. The question is, shall LB 1007 become law notwithstanding the Governor's objections. Commence the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. See page 1609, Journal. 25 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Dickinson moves that the Call be raised. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The Call is raised. Senator Mahoney, do you have something? Do you have anything else right now, Vince? Vince?

CLERK: Yes, but go ahead.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think that if I could just have a moment of your time. Because there will be so many absences, possibly, by Friday...

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney has something for the House here.
