SENATOR BURBACH: Yes, we have got to take those resolutions up today that we have here.

CLERK: Mr. President, there was previously read in the Journal Legislative Resolution 199. Senator Cavanaugh now moves to suspend the rules and consider Legislative Resolution 199. It is in today's Journal so you will not have a copy of it. It reads as follows: See page 1587, Journal. Mr. President, I move to suspend Rule 4, Sec. 5 and consider LR 199 today. Signed Senator Cavanaugh.

PRESIDENT: All right. That is the question. We are wondering all over here. Do you want to just put the question right out, Senator Cavanaugh? Record your vote on the suspension of the rules, please. Please go to your desk and vote on the suspension of the rules. We are not under Call but we will be shortly. Record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: All right. The rules are suspended. Senator Cavanaugh, you move it.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would urge the adoption of this resolution. Mr. Arthur Storz, Sr. is one of the great figures in aviation history in the State of Nebraska. He was only recently retired after being a charter member of the Eppley Airport Authority Board, and without his efforts, the growth and progress of Eppley Airport to the level that it is today would never have been realized. I think it is appropriate that the Legislature and the State of Nebraska recognize Mr. Storz's efforts in the area of aviation progress in the state.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise in support of this resolution. Mr. Storz is a wonderful citizen of the City of Omaha.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is the adoption of this resolution. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The Resolution is adopted.
