PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I think most of you signed this resolution earlier today. The Medical school actually prepared the resolution and requested it. As most of you may have read recently, the Vietnamese doctor program, which, of course, this Legislature was deeply involved in, is about a year and a half ahead of anything that was predicted or hoped for or believed or thought possible. In fact, there is a strong possibility, as I understand it now, that even within the next couple of months it may even move further ahead. They are giving some special additional tests and so these doctors have shown what they could do. The Medical school is going to require some support and assistance and that is why they wanted this resolution. So I would urge its adoption. I move the rules be suspended so the resolution can be considered.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, the rules were suspended for the last previous resolution. We think that it applies to successive resolutions.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Whatever is right.

PRESIDENT: There has been no intervening business. So that rule is still suspended. So the question then is the adoption of the resolution. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. Anything else?

CLERK: Yes, I have got two more resolutions, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The rules are suspended, if we need it, so let's take all resolutions up.

CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Resolution 201 introduced by Senator Cavanaugh and Maresh. Read resolution. See pages 1617 and 1618, Journal. Attached thereto are a series of signatures.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Am I recognized? This resolution was passed around. Everyone has had an opportunity to read it. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, a question of Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I can't explain the metric system.

SENATOR KELLY: No, I am real serious and my question is that what does this resolution do?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Encourages the state to accelerate its
