That, too, Mr. President, because of its stature as a constitutional amendment will be treated as a bill and will be referred to the Reference Committee.

Mr. President, I have received from the Committee on Committees their report regarding the assignment of committees to all legislators. (See pages 72-74 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chronister, did you wish to talk to us about that?

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Yes, Mr. President and members, the Committee on Committees has submitted their report. Each member has a copy of this report. With the exception of one minor change that I would like to call to your attention now, the report is complete. This change involves the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. Senator Fowler will move from that committee to the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee in place of Senator Newell who in turn will take Senator Fowler's place on the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. This is the only minor change involved in the report. I, therefore, move for the adoption of this report as amended. Thank you.
