SENATOR BARRETT: How many are excused?

SENATOR CLARK: Two. Five then I will guess. Five are excused now.

SENATOR BARRETT: If we don't get a few more in a hurry I would like to ask for a Call of the House. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want a Call of the House?

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. All Senators will take their seats and check in, please. Thank you, Senator Carsten. Will everyone check in, please. Yes, we will take call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Newell voting yes. Senator Wiitala voting yes. Senator Clark voting no. Senator Fenger voting yes. Senator Chronister voting yes. Senator Goodrich voting yes. Senator Richard Peterson voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. We will go to LB 248.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 248 was a bill introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by its members. (Read.) The bill was read on January 14. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee for a hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by the Business and Labor Committee.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Barrett, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President and members, the committee amendments are technical. They are simply wording changes striking the word "lowest" and inserting "lower". I think it would be more grammatically correct and of course
