PRESIDENT: The bill is passed. LB 2.

CLERK: (Read LB 2 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 412 and 413, Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is passed. LB 3.

CLERK: (Read LB 3 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? In favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 413, Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The majority having voted in the affirmative,
