Mr. Clerk, LE 66.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before we get to that, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 58 and recommend that same be placed on Select File; LB 50 Select File; LB 138 Select File; LB 139 Select File; LB 88 Select File, all signed by Senator Rod Johnson as Chairman, Mr. President.

Mr. President, I also have a request from Senator Hoagland to print amendments to LB 21 in the Legislative Journal.

Mr. President, with respect to LB 66, I do have E & R amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk recognizes Senator Rod Johnson for Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 66.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move we adopt the E & R amendments to LB 66.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment offered by Senator Vickers to the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, and members, the amendment that I am offering to LB 66 is simply to include for clarification purposes the word "mineral" as well as "oil" and "gas" for the exception from the real estate license. It has been brought to my attention that this was the interpretation of the Real Estate Commission in the past, and since what we are attempting to do here is to reinstate language in the statutes that would allow things to continue as they have been operating, and I might tell you, I just visited this morning with Mr. Quinlan from the Real Estate Commission and he informed me that from the Commission's point of view we should have this word in there for clarification purposes so that people purchasing leases for any other purpose including minerals could be exempted from the Real Estate Licensing Act. So with that explanation, unless there are questions, Mr. President, I would move the adoption of this amendment.
