

want to assure you that it is not I'm sure the introducer's intention or the intention of the Legislature to get into this very deeply. So with that, I hope you will support the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Senator Kahle and Kilgarin have pretty much covered the question. I might just add that this question came to light three or four years ago when a previous administrator by the name of Jess Cervantes had an Attorney General's Opinion brought down which was prepared by Marilyn Hutchinson of the Attorney General's office, and this opinion said that you can't do anything other than in an advocacy nature, and, of course the Director at that time said, okay, you can't do anything other than that. But, of course, they should be able to do a few things that are of a practical nature for people when they want something done rather than call the Lincoln office of the Mexican-American Commission and ask what can be done. So this would merely relieve these people of the problem that they have in thinking that they can't do anything other than in an advocacy position. So I urge the bill's passage.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? The question is on the advancement of LB 83 to Enrollment and Review. The question is to advance. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The question is on the advancement of LB 83. Have you all recorded your vote? We are shy a little of the 25. Members, please record your vote. Have all members present recorded their vote? All members who wish to vote, have you recorded your vote? Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I would ask for a Call of the House, please. A lot of bodies are not here.

PRESIDENT: Does the Chair see five hands? Call of the House has been requested.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Take call in votes if it is....

PRESIDENT: And we will take call in votes for this purpose. The question is, shall the House come under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have all recorded? The question is, shall the House be under Call? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The vote is in the affirmative. The House is
