PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? The question is on the adoption of the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all recorded your vote? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. LB 20. I am sorry. I am working too fast here. The committee amendments have been adopted. Now the question is on the bill as amended. Senator Carsten, now is your chance.

SENATOR CARSTEN: It's all right with me, Mr. President, just move right along there. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 195 modifies various provisions regarding the determination of proof of eligibility for homestead exemptions. The general intent is to clarify and expand upon current provisions rather than to make substantive changes. The bill does arise out of a recent audit of the program by the Department of Revenue and from that audit the department felt that these very modest clarifying amendments and bill needs to be adopted. With that explanation, I would move that LB 195 as amended be advanced to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? The question is, shall the bill advance from General File to E & R for Review? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all recorded your vote? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. The bill is advanced. LB 20, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 20 was introduced by Senators Lamb, Schmit, Richard Peterson, Chronister, Eret, Pappas, Wiitala and Pirsch. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 6th of this year, referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. I have no amendments on the bill.

PRESIDENT: No amendments. The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 20 is a bill which was introduced by several of us in order to further implement a revenue bond financing bill for conservation practices which was enacted two years.
