

Chambers has indicated there might be some rather vociferous objection from constituents for a variety of reasons as some of us have been visiting here this morning. Many times as the families change the names and dates, et cetera, on the accounts would change. It might not really be factual at any case. I think that the information...it does have some possibility to be misused. I would hope that, as far as I am concerned, it makes no difference to me, but it may be one of those pieces of legislation which we do not need and I frankly will not vote for the bill.

PRESIDENT: At this time the Chair would like to take the privilege of, on behalf of Senator Marsh, to announce that she is hosting today a guest and lifelong friend who is in the Chamber under the South balcony, Mrs. Betty Thiel. Welcome to the Legislature. Also guests of Senator Hefner this morning under the North balcony are Art Anderson of Bloomfield, Nebraska, the president of the Nebraska Professional Insurance Agents and Oliver Rohde who is with him from Hamburg, West Germany, who is an exchange student at Bloomfield, and tagging along with them is another man from northeast Nebraska that I have known quite well in public service, Mr. Arlo Wirth of Hartington who hides behind the Cedar County Centennial whiskers. Welcome to the Legislature. Now then, on LB 69 there is a motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, a reminder that the Education Committee would like to conduct an executive session underneath the South balcony right now.

Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to indefinitely postpone LB 69.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely postpone. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, to try to bring this issue to a head I offered this motion. I will make one or two other brief comments. If the theory that Senator Goodrich expressed as the basis for this bill is accepted by the Legislature, what we are telling the public is that a presumption should exist that if a person has not had a bank account or a checking account open for more than a certain period of time, that account should be suspect and the person should perhaps be viewed as somebody who is not honest and you should undergo checks on that individual that you would not somebody else. I don't think it is a very good thing to do at all and I hope that the Legislature will vote to kill this bill. I think that the issues are so obvious that there is no need of me going
