SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Decamp, I might just remind you that should we pass over it, the bill keeps its place in file. Senator Hoagland, did you wish to close on your motion to pass over the bill?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, I concur with Senator DeCamp. I don't think we can work it out in 10 or 15 minutes, Mr. Speaker, but now we are going to be going to General File at ten-thirty. Is that your current plan?

SPEAKER NICHOL: We wanted to get back to Senator Kilgarin's bill, LB 15, and I understand they have that worked out, which would not take long, and then go to General File, yes, if we pass over this bill, yes.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Okay. Well, I think if that is the case, if we will go to General File right after we finish up with Senator Kilgarin's bill, why then why don't I just withdraw my motion to pass it over and then I hope by Monday or Tuesday we can have this worked out.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Is there any objection to the withdrawal of the motion? If none, it is withdrawn and we are now on... we have adopted the Schmit-Wesely amendment. Senator Schmit, do you want to do anything else with it? Oh, excuse me, we have several amendments. Senator Schmit, do you object to us leaving this bill for a while?

SENATOR SCHMIT: No, Mr. President. In the spirit of the nonaggression pacts we have been operating under the last 25 days, let's pass over for a few minutes and see if we can resolve the issue.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. In that case we will go back to LB 15. Okay, do you want to read some things in while we are waiting, Pat?
