

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on the committee amendments? Record the vote. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I would ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested and a roll call vote. All those in favor of a Call of the House will vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. Everyone will check in, please, and all senators within the hearing of my voice will return to the Chamber and check in. There is only two excused. Senator Lamb, will you check in, please. Senator Hefner. Vard Johnson, would you check in, please. We are looking for Senator Newell, Senator Chronister, Senator Vickers, Senator Beutler, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers and Senator Schmit are excused. Senator Haberman, will you check in, please. Senator Wiitala. We are looking for Senator Chronister, Senator Newell. We have found Chronister, now Newell. Senator Wiitala, Senator Pirsch. Senator Carsten, do you want to start with the roll call or do you want to wait until the other three show? We are just short Senator Wiitala. Go ahead, start the roll call but let's have quiet so the Clerk can hear the response, please.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 486 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: The committee amendments are adopted. Now on the bill, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 59 as you will notice from the committee statement is apparently a noncontroversial bill as no one appeared in opposition. (Laughter.)

SENATOR CLARK: The Call is raised. If we can have a little quiet please, Senator Warner can continue.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, those of us who signed LB 59 you will recall during the Special Session in effect made a commitment, at least on the part of ourselves, when the issue was raised whether or not we could anticipate the Board of Equalization as it was composed prior to January of this year would make the adjustment to accommodate the change in the
