on roll call. Senator Chambers, Senator Chronister. The House is under Call. We still have some members....Senator Wiitala. The House is still under Call. Senator Newell, he was here, wasn't he this morning? Senator Newell is absent still. Senator Higgins, Senator Chambers, Senator Carsten.

CLERK: Senator Newell, you had voted yes, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wiitala.

SENATOR WIITALA: Yes, Mr. President, could you record the vote?

PRESIDENT: The House is still under Call. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, 19 nays, excuse me.

PRESIDENT: The motion is in the affirmative. The bill is advanced. The next one is LB 62 A meaning an appropriation bill. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 62A.)

PRESIDENT: And as a matter of formality, the Chair declares the Call of the House raised. Let's see, Senator Wiitala. Senator Wiitala, we are on LB 62A.

SENATOR WIITALA: Mr. President, I just move that we advance LB 62 A to E & R initial, please.

PRESIDENT: The motion is advance LB 62A from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to advance LB 62A, the appropriation bill for LB 62. Please record your vote. I assume that most of the members are still here from the previous Call of the House. If you care to vote please record your vote on the advancement of LB 62A. All members wishing to vote on this measure, have you recorded your vote? Have you all recorded your vote? Have you all recorded the vote? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the A bill.
