

If that is what it does, Senator, then it certainly moves from the noncontroversial to the controversial in a hurry and I would have to check that statute. It will take me a few minutes. I certainly would not go along with that sort of thing. I don't think anyone wants that to happen and even though at the present time the clerks in the court are not calculating it, I will check it for just a few minutes, otherwise I would have to object to hearing the bill at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Fenger, did you wish to close? The question is, shall LB 417 advance from General File. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 417 is advanced. Senator Wesely advised that they are not ready to go on LB 541 so we will advance to LB 522.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 522 was offered by Senator Kahle. (Read.) The bill was read on January 19, referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, members, in connection with the resurvey of a county road that would pass next to some of the acres that the Department of Institutions owns in the Youth Development Center at Kearney, it was discovered that there were .77 of an acre that had been occupied for some time by a neighboring landowner. It lies along a fence line and includes some trees and some pasture and it is poorly suited for inclusion with the rest of the land which the Department leases out. As a result, of course the Department would like to sell it and as we look into this I thought there might be some easier way to dispose of this land than to bring a bill before the Legislature but we found that this was probably the simplest way to do it, so this land is not being used at the present time and really cannot be used by the Department for any of its farming operation and all the other things that they have out there. So I do have a chart here. It is approximately 388 feet long, 77 feet wide on one end and 85 feet wide on the other end and that is the chunk of land. It is along what we call Railroad Street at Kearney and they are doing some work on the street and found out that we had the land, so I move that we move this bill, 522, to E & R initial and get this straightened out.
