

Senators Newell and Cullan would move to amend. The amendment is found on page 523 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, we would request to withdraw that amendment at this time.

SENATOR CLARK: It is withdrawn. The next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to amend the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm not going to offer that amendment at this time since the other one was not attempted, but I am not going to support the bill until other events can develop and in its present form I won't support it but I will withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The amendment is withdrawn. Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I would like to remind the members of this body that we need LB 59 and one of the main reasons we need it, we also need the emergency clause in my estimation is so that the rate, when it goes on, does not have to be higher than 20% substantially in order to make it 20% for the year. I do support LB 59. I do urge your support for LB 59.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator VonMinden.

SENATOR VonMINDEN: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I have a question of Senator Warner.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Warner, will you respond.

SENATOR VonMINDEN: Senator Warner, why do we need a 20% rate to offset the reduction of President Reagan's 10% reduction? To my figures we only need approximately about an 18.6%.

SENATOR WARNER: 18.6...I don't know...Senator VonMinden, the basis of my figures would be what was submitted to us by the Department of Revenue during the Special Session
