SPEAKER NICHOL: Is it against the law now to do that?

SENATOR WARNER: To...

SPEAKER NICHOL: If I am making a left turn and you pass me on the right, is it against the law to do that now?

SENATOR WARNER: As I read this, it is not if you are passing a car that is about to make a turn which you would know by the driver of that vehicle signaling it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? The question is the advancement of LB 406. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on the advancement of LB 406. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. Proceed to LB 133.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 133 was a bill offered by Senator Newell. (Read title). The bill was read on January 11, referred to Miscellaneous Subjects, advanced to General File. I have no amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, LB 133 does not deal with smoking. It deals with liquor and it is a bill that creates a Class K, I don't mind losing, it just hurts a lot, that is all, I do mind losing, but anyway, moving back to LB 133, it creates a new license, a Class K license. The problem is in your metropolitan areas which tend to annex the SIDs. When you have a liquor establishment there that is a bottle club only, when you annex it you have to upgrade it to a Class C. Which means that Omaha has quite a few establishments that have Class C and the number is growing all the time. So what we are proposing here is so we don't have to upgrade their license, we can give them
