I had been thinking of it too but several members of the Rules Committee and others in the Legislature were a little perturbed as some of us have been for quite some time in getting resolutions in that require a lot of time of the Legislature and most of us feel that resolutions are not of the severity that bills are in the Legislature, so what the rule simply says is that the Speaker shall have the
