CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules so as to consider the proposed rule change.

PRESIDENT: Very well, the vote is in the affirmative. The rules have been suspended in order to take up the rule change. May I have a motion to adopt the rule. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I move, Mr. President, that the Legislature adopt the rule change that is set out on page 822 of the Journal which gives the Speaker the authority to refer resolutions to committees rather than have those resolutions heard and debated on the floor upon introduction. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? If not, the question is the proposed rule change as explained by Senator Hoagland and written in your Journal. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. 30 votes required. The motion is on the proposed rule change. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Yes, Senator.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers requests record vote. (Read the record vote as found on page 843 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the proposed rules change.

PRESIDENT: The required majority has been received and the rule is changed. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, some reports. Your committee on Public Works whose Chairman is Senator Schmit reports LB 122 advanced to General File with committee amendments attached; LB 309 General File with committee amendments attached; 348 General File with committee amendments attached, and 506 General File with committee amendments attached, all signed by Senator Schmit. Your committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation reports LR 21(CA) indefinitely postponed, and LB 610 advanced to General File with committee amendments attached. (See pages 847-848 of the Legislative Journal.)
