and I have been told that and we proceed...we will now take up LB 134. Senator Pappas.

CLERK: I have no amendments on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. President, members and colleagues, after much study and deliberation and research, you were presented this morning with a new fiscal note on it that was prepared just the other day. I don't think it is in your book yet and so I handed one out. Basically, 134 will not cost the state anything. Any increase in rates will be beared by the employees of the state which receive the direct benefits from it, unless the law is changed. On the fiscal note down at the bottom you will notice that the maximum, if a higher percent three times the number of that are retiring now will retire, about the maximum it would cost is 72 cents a month per employee. That is figured in, the way they figured that figure is not replacing any of the retired employees with younger employees which would actually make a younger wage pool and lower the rates. I move to advance it to E & R.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor of advancing the bill say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. That is LB 134. Now we proceed to LB 542A.

CLERK: I have no amendments on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely...oh, Rod Johnson, excuse me.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I move that we advance LB 542 to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. Senator Johnson, that was to adopt the amendments?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: No, that was to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill has been advanced, very well. LB 313.

CLERK: No amendments, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move that we advance LB 313 to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried, the bill is advanced. LB 181.
