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caseloads over the last three or four years in the district courts and the county courts have indicated that the caseloads of district courts are increasing dramatically, the caseloads in county courts have been going down, down, down. So by increasing the jurisdiction of the county courts, you are going to have an ameliorating effect on those two trends, an effect that will tend to level off the caseloads in both the district court and the county court.

SENATOR GOLL: So are you saying then that what may go up on one side will go down on the other so that, in effect, we would have a shifting and there would be no increase in money?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That is exactly what I am saying, and the second part of what I am saying is that the county court caseloads are going down now anyway, so they have the existing facilities to deal with an increased workload anyway I believe.

SENATOR GOLL: It won't cost any more money.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR GOLL: Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I just wanted to confirm what Senator Beutler said with the amendment why there is no essential fiscal impact from the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Given all the facts and situations that we heard and given what I know about the court systems, I don't conceive of any way that any one would be justified coming in and asking for any more money on this.

SENATOR WARNER: Right, and that is what I just said, there is no impact as long as this committee amendment of taking the county divorce proceedings out, then there is no impact.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I believe that to be true, yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Goll, did you wish to speak again? Your light is on.

SENATOR GOLL: Let's call the question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do I see five hands? We don't need five
