CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is withdrawn. We will move on to reports. Mr. Clerk, the first one has to do with the Public Health Committee.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fenner offers a report that is found on page 803 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Fenner.

SENATOR FENNER: Is that Gina Dunning's, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR FENNER: Thank you, Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Legislature. After duly advertised public hearing, public input, the Public Health and Welfare Committee recommended the confirmation of Gina Dunning as the Chief of the Department of Public Welfare, soon to be Department of Human Services, and we would recommend confirmation by the body at large.
