

before the comma insert 'and sections 1 to 30 of this act'; and in line 8 strike 'sections' and show as stricken, strike 'and' and show as stricken, and after the second comma insert 'and sections 1 to 30 of this act.' Again, this is just a housekeeping measure since we struck one whole section to show that they are now sections 1 to 30 instead of 31. And 'in the standing committee amendments found on page 801 of the Journal, on page 1, line 17, after 'visiting' insert 'and business'." The standing committee amendments gave relatives and friends the right to visit only during visiting hours when they actually meant to make it the same as volunteers have, "business and visiting hours." So I would move the adoption of those three amendments of mine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any discussion on those three amendments of Senator Higgins? If not, the question is, shall the Higgins' amendments be adopted. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Higgins' amendment. (Amendment appears on page 928 of the Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Higgins' amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hefner would now move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, on your desk is a four part amendment to LB 235 and of course these are about the same amendments that was offered by Senator Lowell Johnson a week ago and of course these are also the amendments that were proposed at the committee hearing that was held earlier in the session. These amendments were proposed by the Nebraska Health Care Association. The first part of the amendment, Section 12, page 4, line 26-27, delete "or any representative of a community legal services program." And then the second amendment, that is to correct section 18, subchapter 1, page 9, line 3, after "resident," add "until necessary corrections are made but in no case." This language would make it clear that the period of time during which the admissions are prohibited is clearly tied to the time for correcting any violations of the regulations and is not merely arbitrary. And the second part of that amendment is section 18, chapter 2, page 9, line 21, after "corrections" add "or satisfactory progress toward the corrections." This addition incorporates current Department of Health policy which recognizes good faith, satisfactory progress toward making corrections when some reasonable delay or delay beyond the control of the administrator precludes completion of the correction.
