

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: You're on.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment to this bill was something that was brought to me last evening. I met with a number of campers in my district. It concerns the duplicate permit question which Senator Labeledz and Senator Morehead had adopted in the form of an amendment last week. What they did was allow one additional duplicate at half the cost of a regular permit which would be \$5.00 in this case. What I found in talking to these campers is that one duplicate is really not adequate. They have many cases more than that number of vehicles, a motorcycle, a car, a trailer that they would take to these different parks and they feel that it is not fair to limit them to one duplicate. They think it would be far more reasonable to have for instance, in this case I am asking for two duplicates. They would like more but I think it is reasonable to request that we amend this bill to allow for two duplicates in addition to the permit rather than the one duplicate which is now the case and I would ask for your support for that amendment.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. Again, this bill is taking a very, very long time. I'm going to have to stand and oppose the two duplicates. We compromised the last time it was on the floor to one amendment...incidentally it is going to be very difficult even with one duplicate amendment for the Games and Parks to take care of the abuse that was originally for three or four years. What happened before was people could go into the vendor and buy as many as they want. What we are going to do this time as I explained before on General File, we're going to issue the annual permit with a perforated receipt. The receipt then is used to buy one duplicate permit. It is going to be very difficult otherwise. I'm going to have to object to two amendments and go with the one amendment. Thank you very much...not amendment, duplicate, I'm sorry.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator Labeledz. Senator Cullan, your light is on.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise in strong opposition to Senator Wesely's amendment. I urge us to get on with the business of the day. My gosh, if people can't do it with two duplicates, that is just too bad. I think these are the people that certainly are not in need of any further state assistance, people who think they need more than two vehicles into the state parks. I urge you to reject the amendments and let's quickly get on with 199.
