showed up in opposition to this bill. All the opposition belonged to private enterprise whose pocketbook could ultimately be affected by the implementation of 150. LB 150 is for the first time, on page 2, you will find it is a declaration of intent by this legislative body as to what an SID should be, and that is a vehicle to assist private enterprise and a community working together to promote orderly growth. No SID will be formed outside of the zoning limits of a city pursuant to LB 150. On page 6 and 7 the new language requires city approval prior to the filing of a petition in District Court asking for the creation of an SID. Page 8 requires that same approval for an expansion of territory of any existing SID. The stricken language on page 11 will allow for cities to commence action to appoint an administrator in any SID in the total zoning jurisdiction rather than just those SIDs that are immediately adjacent to the city limits. Last week when it looked like this bill was coming up, I had passed out to this body a rather impressive list of cities in the State of Nebraska who have written endorsing the concept, and if it missed your desk, I have an extra copy back here for anyone. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
