SENATOR V. JOHNSON: The amendment is withdrawn. What is next on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is from Senators Newell and Cullan, on page 523 of the Journal.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, the amendment that Senator Cullan and others and I have introduced is an amendment to make LB 59 look a lot like LB 169, and since 169 is on Select File and being discussed, and 59 has been held up, maybe it is not as appropriate right now to offer that amendment. So with that said, unless there are others who are anxious to make 59 look like 169, I would suggest that those of us who have offered the amendments would withdraw them at this time.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I understand your request...you say Senator Cullan is also on the amendment. Senator Cullan's light is on. What is your pleasure, Senator Cullan?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, my pleasure is to see 59 follow 169 and not precede it and so I would put a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill up there so that we can lay this measure over as well.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, I understand your request, Senator Cullan. We have a motion up to do exactly what you would like to have done. However, it is not yet in order. We have a process we have to follow which means we have to go through a series of amendments....

SENATOR CULLAN: I will withdraw my amendment then, Mr. President.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Thank you very much. Your amendment is withdrawn. Now do we have another amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I had a motion from Senator Beutler.
