SPEAKER NICHOL: Sergeant at Arms, how are we doing? Obviously not very well. We have Senator Beutler now. Sergeant at Arms, how about the other three, Warner, Haberman and Goodrich? Senator Chambers, we are looking for only Senator Haberman. What do you think?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think we might go on with it. We can go on with the vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you mean proceed? Okay, now we are having a roll call vote. Will you please take your seats now. We are under Call. Thank you for returning to your seat, sorry for the big delay. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 1013-1014 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. I would please ask the body, when we do go under Call will you please respond quickly so we don't lose so much time. Thank you.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler, we are on the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank God, advance the bill, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Is there any other discussion on the bill? Senator Landis. The question is, shall the bill be advanced. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Excuse me, say aye, that's right, all those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. LB 391.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 391, I have no E & R amendments, Mr. President. I do have an amendment from Senator Carsten. That is found on page 994 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I would move for the adoption of the amendments. They have been printed and the reason we passed over it yesterday was that you would have a chance to look at them. They are printed in the Journal starting at the bottom of page 993 and continuing on 994.
