LB 269, 269A

The question is, shall LB 269 advance? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the advancement of the bill. Senator Cullan, six are excused. Have you all voted that would like to vote? Senator Cullan. Say it again, would you?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, I guess we will have to ask for a Call of the House and call in votes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The House is under Call. Will you please take your seats. Those listening on the PA, would you please come to the legislative floor and record your presence? Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Sergeant at Arms, will you please locate those that are not excused. So please when you do return to your seat, please record your presence. Senator Kahle, Labedz, Chambers, please record your presence. Senator Fowler, please record your presence. Senator Schmit. Senator Higgins. Senator Cullan, do you want to accept call ins?

CLERK: Senator Higgins voting yes. Senator Chronister voting yes. Senator Remmers voting no.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Okay, would you please stay under Call until we vote on the A bill please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 269A (read title).

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, this just appropriates the funds necessary to implement 269. I would ask for it to be moved.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Fenger.

SENATOR FENGER: Thank you, Mr. President. Now that the bill itself has got enough green lights to advance, I would merely caution the body. A short while ago we advanced 363. If
