to June 30, '85, for the purpose of simply revising the sales tax collection forms to show the variable sales tax rate. I move the bill at this time.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? Senator Newell. Is there further discussion on the Appropriations bill, 571A? If not, ready for the vote. The question is the advancement of LB 571A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, my green light won't work.

PRESIDENT: Both you and I are suffering from ceremonial burnout, Senator Higgins. Senator Higgins votes aye I believe is what she wants to show us. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. The bill is advanced. Anything on your desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, LB...excuse me, Ag and Environment reports LB 505 advanced to General File; LB 73 General File with committee amendments. Those are signed by Senator Haberman. (See page 1058 of the Journal.)

Public Health reports LB 140 advanced to General File and LB 611 indefinitely postponed, both those signed by Senator Fenger. (See page 1058 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Very well, LB 432. Mr. President, LB 432 offered by Senator Newell. (Read.) The bill was first read on January 18, referred to Business and Labor. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by the Business and Labor Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wiitala.

SENATOR WIITALA: Thank you, Mr. President. Basically, members, the committee amendments would provide that the work accepted must be previously secured, permanent, full time, insured work which offers reasonable expectation of betterment of wages and working conditions. What that boils down to is that the committee amendment which was adopted without opposition by the Business and Labor Committee, improves the bill and tightens it up and clarifies what the introducer intended to begin with. I would move the advancement of these amendments. Thank you.
